



CRH: complicit in illegal occupation of Palestine and not complying with international law

Cement Roadstone Holdings (CRH) is an Irish-owned international building materials firm that we believe is complicit in Israel's illegal occupation of Palestine. This charge is based on:

CRH's failure to comply with international law due to its awareness of, proximity to and financial benefit derived from the construction of Israel's 450km-long illegal apartheid wall, colonial settlements, settler-only roads and light rail system.

At the recent Russell Tribunal on Palestine, leading human rights barrister Michael Mansfield concluded that the conduct of CRH activities in occupied Palestine is morally reprehensible and exposes the company to legal liability for these violations.

Nobel Peace Prize laureate Mairead Corrigan Maguire has appealed to ordinary people to stand up for human rights and to support the Palestinian call for Boycott, Divestment and Sanction (BDS) against Israel until the illegal occupation of Palestine is ended.

The Apartheid Wall, started in 2002 and still under construction, de facto annexes nearly 50% of the West Bank and completely destroys all continuity of life in the region. Palestinians are routinely treated like prisoners in their own land. A coalition of NGOs – including the Ireland Palestine Solidarity Campaign (IPSC) and human rights lawyers – hopes to take a civil action against CRH in the Irish Courts. This would be an injunction requiring CRH to stop its involvement in unlawful activities in the OPT, and reparations for the victims on whose behalf the claim is submitted.
